LABORATORY TECHNICIANS





Occupation: Laboratory Technicians

Education: Associate's (with additional on the job training), or Bachelor's Degree

Laboratory Technicians work in many different fields of study, such as medical, research and development, testing laboratories, pharmaceutical and medicine manufacturing, wholesale trade, and state, local, or private universities or technical schools. Duties included as a laboratory technician include assisting technicians or engineers, monitoring process to test product quality, maintain instruments and equipment, and conducting, compiling, interpreting, and analyzing results from experiments and tests. This employment field is expected to grow approximately 3% in the near future, which is average growth for most occupations. The diversity of employment opportunities provides innumerable options where you can apply your skills!

CASA FOR CHILDREN, INC.

CASA For Children, Inc. is a nonprofit organization that trains volunteers to advocate for abused and neglected children in the court system. CASA For Children, Inc. is organized to speak for the best interest of abused and neglected children in court. They promote and support volunteer representation for children in an effort to provide each child with a safe, permanent, and nurturing home. Trained volunteers are used to amplify children's voices and provide the insight necessary for judges to make the best possible decisions. The CASA serves as the "eyes and ears" of the judge for children in foster care.

CASA For Children, Inc. is located at 102 East Chickasaw Avenue, Sallisaw, Okla. 74955. Oklahoma currently has 22 CASA programs, serving children in 61 of the 77 counties in Oklahoma.

The Juvenile Division of the Sequoyah County District Court focuses on cases that involve minors (children under the age of 18). A Juvenile Deprived case involves abuse and/or neglect of a minor. Due to the large number of children the Juvenile Court serves, it's difficult for parties to a case to have direct contact with a child. CASA volunteers are assigned to directly interact with children and make recommendations to the court in the child's best interest.

DISCOVER YOUR LEARNING STYLE PREFERENCES

If you are looking to improve your grades, gain knowledge about yourself and discover test-taking strategies, the workshop "Discover your Learning Style Preferences", presented by Dr. Saundra Yancy McGuire, gives you a guide to do all of that. You will become aware of your personal learning styles, find new strategies for success on tests and learn how to improve the quality of classwork.

Dr. McGuire understands that there are many methods for teaching students how to find and use their personal learning styles, but she prefers to use the VARK method to teach the student to find and use their own personal learning style. Each letter of VARK represents a style of personal learning:

V=Visual

A=Aural

R=Read/Write

K=Kinesthetic

Dr. McGuire ties these learning styles to learning strategies and demonstrates how they work hand-in-hand to help the student improve classwork, homework and of course, tests.

As you watch and learn from this rich workshop, identify your own personal learning style. Use the strategies Dr. McGuire gives you and apply them to your personal study habits. You will most likely improve your grades and learn even more during your college journey.

DINING ON A DIME

A RECIPE FOR THRIFTY STUDENTS





Dirty Rice

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 pound ground pork sausage
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 rib celery, chopped
- 1 green pepper, seeded and chopped
- · 2 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon Cajun seasoning
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 4 cups cooked white rice (cooked in chicken broth)
- · 2 green onions, finely sliced
- 2 tablespoons fresh parsley
- Salt & pepper to taste

Instructions:

- Brown the ground beef and pork sausage in a large skillet over medium heat. When it is about halfway through the browning process add the onions, celery and green pepper.
 Cook until vegetables are tender
- Reduce the heat to low and add the garlic, cooking for one minute, while stirring constantly. Sitr in the Cajun seasoning, chicken broth, and rice. Add the parsley, green onions, and season with salt and pepper to taste

FITNESS TIPS

THREE AT HOME WORKOUTS FOR BEGINNERS





Side-Lying Hip Abduction

- Lie on your right side with your legs stacked (You can bend your right leg for more support)
- Lift left leg up, then lower it toward the floor
- Repeat this motion
- Switch sides
- Shoot for 3 sets of 10 reps on each side

Straight-Leg Donkey Kick

- Start on all fours, with knees under hips and hands under shoulders
- Extend left leg straight behind you, keeping your foot flexed and toes pointed down toward the floor
- Return to the starting position
- Repeat on the other side
- Do 3 sets of 10 reps on each side

Standing March

- Stand with feet shoulder-width apart, arms straight and relaxed by your sides, and knees close together
- Squeeze abs to lift one knee up, keeping bottom of your foot parallel with the floor
- Lower your knee back down
- · Repeat on the other side
